The Giants and Dodgers finished in a dead heat for first place in the National League with identical 101-61 records at the end of the regular season. The result was a three-game playoff with the Giants winning Game One at Candlestick Park, 8-0, as Billy Pierce bested the Dodgers' Sandy Koufax. The Dodgers won Game Two at Dodger Stadium, 8-7, before the Giants came back with a four-run ninth inning in Game Three at Dodger Stadium to win the N.L. title by a score of 6-4. The Dodgers had won a coin-flip to get home field advantage in the best-of-three series. The regular season series between the two arch-rivals favored the Giants, 11-10...The Yankees won the World Series, 4-3, but the Giants gave the long-ball hitting ball club from New York all they could handle...Willie Mays led the majors with 49 home runs and the Giants with 141 runs batted in. Mays also scored 130 runs to tie the Dodgers Maury Wills for second place in the big leagues. The "Baby Bull," Orlando Cepeda, mashed 35 homers, drove home 114 runs, and scored 105 times. Felipe Alou had a big season as well after hitting 25 dingers and driving in 98 runs. "Big Mac," Willie McCovey, contributed 20 home runs and 54 runs batted in. Catchers Tom Haller and Ed Bailey, both lefthanded batters, hit 35 home runs between them. The Giants led the N.L. with 204 homers, a .278 batting average, and runs scored (878)...Jack Sanford was 24-7 for the year to lead the pitching staff. Billy O'Dell was 19-14 and led the staff with 195 K's and 20 complete games. Juan Marichal was an 18-game winner and lefty Billy Pierce--the one-time White Sox hurler--was a sparkling 16-6 for the season. Marichal was second on the staff with 153 strikeouts and 18 complete games. Giants' hurlers posted a 3.79 ERA and led the league with 62 complete games...Giants' fans, almost 1.6 million of them, braved the cold temperatures and frequent gale-force winds to enjoy baseball at the ball park on Candlestick Point.
