Mike Trout produced another "heavenly" season by leading The Halos with 39 home runs and 101 runs scored. The perennial All Star topped the majors in on-base percentage (.460) and OPS (1.088). He finished second in A. L. MVP voting while his batting average was fifth in the big leagues. Justin Upton (30 homers) led the ball club in RBI (85); Andrelton Simmons posted the most base hits (162). As a team, the Angels hit .242 and 214 home runs...American League Rookie of the Year and the much bally-hoed two-way star Shohei Ohtani won four ball games out of his ten as a starting pitcher and hit .285 with 22 home runs, twenty as the designated hitter. On the pitching rubber, he struck out sixty-three. Twenty-one-year-old Jaime Barria led the staff in wins (10). Andrew Heaney was tops with 180 K's. The staff ERA was 4.15...Baseball's longest-tenured active manager as of 2018, Mike Scioscia retired after the season with a career 1,650 wins and a World Championship in 2002. He served as skipper for nineteen years and recorded a .536 winning percentage.
