Team leader Paul Goldschmidt got off to a very puzzling slow start at the plate but returned to the top spot of the D-Backs in home runs (33), base hits (172), and doubles (35). *"Goldy"* drove in eighty-three. David Peralta clubbed thirty homers and led the ball club with eighty-seven runs batted in and batting average. For the season, the D-Backs hit .235 (twelfth in the N.L.) and 176 home runs (seventh)...The pitching staff posted the third lowest ERA in the senior circuit (3.72) and finished third with 1,448 strikeouts. Zack Greinke and Zack Godley led the staff with fifteen wins apiece. Lefty Patrick Corbin was tops with 246 punch outs and contributed eleven victories. Greinke rang up 199 K's; Godley whiffed one hundred eighty-five. Closer Brad Boxberger struck out seventy-one...Arizona opened the campaign with nine straight wins and were 47-34 at the season's mid-point. They were also tied for first place in the NL West as late as September 1<sup>st</sup> (74-62). An 8-18 record to wind up the year took them out of the running for a play-off spot. The D-Backs concluded the season 9 ½ games behind division champ Los Angeles who also won their season series, 11-8.
