Rookie manager Alex Cora was handed a very potent line-up, but he WAS given a great deal of credit for the 118th Edition of the Red Sox surpassing the ball club's previous record for wins (105, 1912) in a season and a World Series triumph over the Dodgers in five games...Free agent J. D. Martinez was signed to a contract during the off-season and all he did was lead the team in homers (43), RBI (130), and base hits (188). "Mookie" Betts posted an MVP-type season while leading the Bosox in runs scored (129) and doubles (47). He also blasted 32 home runs and led the majors in batting average. As a team, Boston led the A. L. after hitting .268. They were sixth with 208 home runs...Leading the pitching staff in wins were Rick Porcello (17), David Price (16), Eduardo Rodriguez (13), and Chris Sale (12). Sale had to deal with nagging shoulder ailments all season long but still topped the staff in strikeouts (237). Closer Craig Kimbrel whiffed 96 batters. An ERA of 3.75 placed Boston third in the league. They finished third after tallying 1,558 strikeouts for the season...Steve Pearce was named World Series MVP. In fifty games after joining the Red Sox from Toronto, Pearce clubbed seven homers and drove home twenty-six. The well-traveled, thirty-five-year-old slugger put up a .333 average, three homers, and eight RBI during the Series...Martinez, on a chase for the Triple Crown most of the season, led the majors in runs batted in. He ended up second to Betts in batting average and runner-up in home runs.
