Rookie outfielder Daniel Palka provided a sneak peek of great-things-to-come for the White Sox in the future after leading the ball club with 27 homers and finishing second in RBI (67). He placed fifth in A.L. Rookie of the Year voting. Cuban slugger Jose Abreu walloped 22 home runs and led the team with 78 RBI. Yolmer Sanchez was the Sox leader in base hits (145) while Tim Anderson's 77 runs scored set a team high. Chicago popped 182 homers and hit .241 for the year... The pitching staff had one double-digit winner in Lucas Giolito (10). James Shields posted the most strikeouts (154). The staff was eleventh in the league with a 4.83 ERA. Reliever Danny Farquhar collapsed in the dugout after a relief appearance on April 20th. Doctors later revealed he had suffered a ruptured brain aneurysm. He was released from hospital on May 7th with an endorsement from physicians he would eventually make a full recovery. Farquhar missed the remainder of the '18 season and declared for free-agency at the end of the year. Youngster Michael Kopech, a bullet-throwing righthander and listed as baseball's 13th Best Prospect, debuted in the majors August 21st and made four starts before undergoing "Tommy John Surgery," September 18th. In the minors, Kopech's fastball had been unofficially timed as high as 110 MPH. His elbow surgery will force him to forego the 2019 season.
