The Yankees returned to a renovated Yankee Stadium in '76 after being tenants of the Mets in '74 and '75. (The furthest reaches of centerfield have been reduced from 461' to 417' and the monuments--once in deepest center--are now out of play in a newly created "Monument Park".) "The Bronx Bombers" won the AL East by 10 ½ games and needed a home run from Chris Chambliss in the last of the ninth, Game Five of the ALCS, to go to the World Series for the first time since 1964. "The Big Red Machine" from Cincinnati was in peak form and swept the Fall Classic, four games to none. New York was outscored 22-8 in the four contests...Graig Nettles was the American League leader with 32 home runs. He drove home ninety-three. Chambliss, Thurman Munson, and Oscar Gamble all bashed 17 homers. Munson had a team high 105 RBI while Chambliss drove in 96 more. Munson was named the American League's Most Valuable Player. On Opening Day at Yankee Stadium, it was announced that Munson was chosen as the new Team Captain, the first player to be bestowed the honor since Lou Gehrig. Chambliss led the Yanks with 188 base hits including 32 doubles. Roy White topped the ball club with 104 runs scored. The Yankees ended the year second in the A.L. with a .269 batting average and 120 home runs...Ed Figueroa led the pitching staff with a 19-10 won/loss record and four shutouts. "Catfish" Hunter was 17-15 with a staff leading 173 strikeouts and 21 complete games. Dock Ellis was a 17-game winner, as well, on a pitching corps which led the A.L. in ERA at 3.19...Skipper Billy Martin, in his first full year directing the team from the dugout, was named A.L. Manager of the Year.
