"The Big Red Machine" has reached its apex: A three-game sweep of the Phillies in the NLCS and a four-game sweep of the Yankees in the World Series. The Redlegs became the first team to "sweep" through the post-season since divisional play began in 1969. Joe Morgan was the National League's Most Valuable Player for the second consecutive season while Johnny Bench took MVP honors in the Fall Classic...George Foster led the Reds with 29 homers and 121 RBI. Joe Morgan finished the regular season with 27 round-trippers, 111 RBI, and 113 runs scored. Pete Rose held the team high in hits (215), runs scored (130), and doubles (42). Tony Perez added 91 RBI. Not surprisingly, the Reds topped the N.L. in batting average (.280), home runs (141), runs (857), base hits (1,599), and stolen bases (210)...Gary Nolan was the team's top winner with 15 victories. Fourteen-game winner Pat Zachry led the pitching staff with 143 K's. Fred Norman (12-7) topped the staff with eight complete games. Jack Billingham won twelve contests as well. The staff ERA was fifth in the N.L. (3.51)...Seven Reds' players were part of the N.L. All Star squad. The franchise set an all-time attendance record in '76 by drawing over 2.6 million fans to Riverfront Stadium...Cincinnati had a plus-224 difference between runs scored and runs allowed...The '76 Redlegs are considered to be among the best baseball teams in the history of the game.
