"Buster" Posey was the National League MVP after posting the league's highest batting average and a team high 24 homers, 103 RBI, 178 base hits, and 39 doubles. Pablo Sandoval followed with 12 home runs and 63 RBI. He was limited to 108 games after breaking a bone in his left wrist. Melky Cabrera hit the baseball for a "triple double": 25 doubles, 10 triples, and 11 home runs. He also won the All Star Game's MVP Award after going two for three with a home run and two RBI. On August 15th, Cabrera was suspended for 50 games after testing positive for using an illegal substance. The Giants hit .269 for the season but were LAST in the N.L. with 103 homers...Matt Cain (16-5, 193 strikeouts) and Madison Bumgarner (16-11, 191 strikeouts) were the leaders of the pitching staff. Cain tossed a no-hit perfect game versus Houston at A T @ T Park, June 13th. He tied "Sandy" Koufax for the major league record with 14 K's in his "perfecto". Barry Zito was 15-8 while Ryan Vogelsong won 14 contests. Tim Lincecum finished 10-15 with 190 strikeouts. The staff ERA was 3.68...The Giants beat the Reds in the NLDS, 3-2, after falling behind two games to none. They won the last three in Cincinnati. The Giants were trailing the Cardinals in the NLCS, 3-1, before completing a three-game sweep to eliminate St. Louis in seven games. The World Series MVP was Pablo Sandoval who hit for a lusty .500 average including three home runs. Hunter Pence and Marco Scutaro proved to be two huge mid-season additions which helped the team sweep Detroit, four games to none, in the Fall Classic. A great all-around baseball team.
