The great career of Henry Aaron--"Hammerin' Hank"--ended in 1976 in the town where he began a Hall of Fame performance. With 755 "Big Flies," he retired as the home run champion of baseball with grace, dignity and honor. Aaron hit his last big league homer off the Angels' Dick Drago, July 20th, at County Stadium. The forty-two year old Aaron hit 10 homers and drove in 35 runs in his final season...George Scott led the ball club with 18 home runs, 77 RBI, 166 base hits, 21 doubles, and 73 runs scored. Don Money was next after popping twelve homers and knocking in sixty-two. For the year, the Brewers hit .246 and 88 homers...Bill Travers led the pitching staff with 15 wins and 15 complete games. Jim Slaton won fourteen and topped the staff with 138 strikeouts. Jim Colborn and lefty Jerry Augustine both finished with nine victories. Augustine and Bill Travers tied for the lead with three shutouts. The staff was ninth in the A.L. after posting a 3.64 ERA...Their record for the first half of the season was 35-46 with the ball club 17 games out of first.
