The Expos, playing in their final season at Jarry Park, took a big step back from the previous season. They won twenty fewer games in '76 compared to the year before... Larry Parrish was the only member of the team to reach double digits in homers (11). He led the team in RBI (61) and runs scored (65). Tim Foli, who hit for the cycle at Wrigley Field in April, had the team high in hits (144) and doubles (36). Montreal was LAST in the N.L. in batting (.235) and sixth in home runs (94)... "Woodie" Fryman (13 wins) and Steve Rogers (150 strikeouts) led the pitching staff. Don Stanhouse won nine games. Expo pitchers had a 3.99 ERA, last in the league... The Expos scored 531 runs and gave up 734... Managers' records: Kuehl (43-85), Fox (13-22). Charlie Fox took over in the dugout September 4<sup>th</sup>... They won ONE season series, 7-5, versus the Giants.
