Second sacker Ted Sizemore (160 hits, four homers, 46 RBI) was named the National League's Rookie of the Year. Andy Kosco led the ball club with 19 homers and 74 runs batted in. First baseman Wes Parker won a Gold Glove and was second on the team with 68 RBI. He hit 13 homers...Starting pitchers Claude Osteen and Bill Singer both won twenty games and completed sixteen. Singer topped the staff with 247 strikeouts while Osteen twirled seven shutouts. Don Sutton (17-18 W/L record) had 217 K's. Closer Jim Brewer whiffed 92 batters. The staff ERA was 3.08 and surrendered the least bases on balls in the N. L. (420)...Dodger batters hit .254 with 97 home runs. Their 52 triples led the league...L. A. finished the season eight games behind division champion Atlanta with whom the Dodgers split their season series, 9-9. The Giants won the season's match-ups between the arch-rivals, 13-5...This ball club, compiled with a core group of good young players and more on the near horizon, turned a corner for the franchise. The Dodgers would not finish in the second division again until 1984.
