The first NL West Division Champions with the arrival of "divisional" play, the Braves would eventually lose the first National League Championship Series (NLCS) to the "Amazin" Mets, three games to none...

At that time, it was always a treat to watch Chief Noc-A-Homa sprint from the Braves' dugout to his teepee just beyond the outfield fence in the leftfield corner at Fulton County Stadium, often referred to as "The Launching Pad." The Chief would emerge from his quarters and do a "war dance" on his porch after a Braves' player hit a home run...Hank Aaron led the ball club with 44 homers, 97 runs batted in, and 100 runs. Orlando Cepeda, who carried the nicknames "Cha Cha" and "The Baby Bull," was next with 22 dingers and 88 RBI. A fabulous hitter (and often injured), Rico Carty hit 16 home runs. Felix Millan led the team with 174 hits. The Braves hit .258 and were third in the N.L. with 141 home runs...Leading the pitching staff was knuckleballer Phil Niekro with a 23-13 W/L record, 193 strikeouts, 21 complete games and four shutouts. Tall and lean righthander Ron Reed went 18-10 while Pat Jarvis and lefty George Stone both won thirteen contests. Reed had 160 K's. The staff ERA was sixth in the league at 3.53 to end the year...The Braves edged out the Giants by three games for the NL West crown. The teams split their season series, 9-9.
