Willie McCovey was named National League MVP. “Big Mac” hit 45 home runs and drove home one-hundred twenty-six. He finished fourth in the major leagues in homers and second in runs batted in. McCovey had 157 base hits and scored 101 runs for the year. Bobby Bonds added 32 home runs, 90 RBI, and team highs in base hits (161) and runs scored (120). Willie Mays, at 38 years of age, may have shown signs of slowing down. In 117 games played he hit 13 homers, drove in fifty-eight, stroked 114 base hits, and scored 64 runs. The Giants hit .242 and 136 home runs...Juan Marichal led the pitching staff with a 21-11 W/L record, 27 complete games, and eight shutouts. Marichal struck out 205 batters. Gaylord Perry was 19-14 with a staff leading 233 strikeouts. He completed 26 games and hit his first major league home run off the Dodgers’ Claude Osteen. Frank Linzy won fourteen games out of the bullpen; Mike McCormick was an eleven-game winner. The Giants’ pitching staff ended the year with a 3.26 ERA and a league best 71 complete games...San Francisco was a second place team for the fifth consecutive year--only three games behind Atlanta in the NL West in ‘69. The two teams split their season meetings, 9-9. The Giants were 13-5 versus the Dodgers, 11-1 against the expansion Les Expos de Montreal and better than San Diego twelve games to six.
