On "Mickey Mantle Day," June 8th, "The Mick's" Number Seven was retired while he was immortalized with a plaque hung on Yankee Stadium's centerfield wall close to the monuments for Ruth, Gehrig, and Miller Huggins. (Mantle had retired following the '68 season which ended a career that started with a bang in 1951.)...Team leaders: Joe Pepitone (27 homers, 70 RBI) and Bobby Murcer (26 home runs, 82 RBI). Horace Clarke led the team in hits (183). Murcer and Clarke tied for the team lead with 82 runs scored. For the season, the Yanks hit .235 and 94 home runs. Their 44 triples led the American League...Mel Stottlemeyre (20-14 W/L record) led the Yankees in wins and with 24 complete games. "Fritz" Peterson won 17 ball games and topped the pitching staff with 150 strikeouts and four shutouts. Stan Bahnsen was a nine-game winner while Jack Aker won eight out of the bullpen. The staff ERA was 3.23, second in the A.L....Future Yankee captain Thurman Munson made his major league debut, August 8th, going two for three versus Oakland and driving home his first two career runs.
