Many say one of the big turning points in the season for the Metropolitanans was the acquisition of first baseman Donn Clendenon from the Expos at the trade deadline, June 15th.

"Meet the Mets, meet the Mets. Step right up and greet the Mets. Bring your kiddies, bring your wife; guaranteed to have the time of your life!!..."

Tommie Agee led the Mets with 26 home runs, 76 RBI, and 99 runs scored. Cleon Jones topped the Metropolitanans in base hits (164) and doubles (25). He crossed the plate ninety-two times...National League Cy Young Award winner Tom Seaver led the pitching staff with a 25-7 record, 208 strikeouts, and 18 complete games. Jerry Koosman was 17-9 with 180 K's, sixteen complete games, and a team high six shutouts...The Mets outraced the Cubs by eight games to win the NL East. (A black cat that sneaked onto the field during a game at Shea and sauntered behind the Cubs captain Ron Santo in the on-deck circle apparently CURSED the Chicagos.) They beat the Cubbies in their season series, 10-8...New York hit .242 and 109 homers for the year...The staff ERA was 2.99. They were the league-leader with sixteen shutouts...The Mets swept the Braves in the first National League Championship Series--two games to none in a best-of-three--to earn the right to meet Baltimore in the Fall Classic and win their first major league title, four games to one.
