Reggie Jackson slammed 47 homers and collected 118 RBI to lead the A's offense. At one point during the season, he was ahead of the home run paces of both Roger Maris (1961) AND Babe Ruth (1927) when the two former Yankees set their individual records, respectively...Sal Bando hit 31 dingers and drove in 113 runs. He also led the A's in hits (171). Jackson was tops with 123 runs scored. Oakland hit .249 for the season and 148 home runs... "Blue Moon" Odom and Chuck Dobson were co-leaders of the pitching staff with 15 wins apiece. Odom and "Catfish" Hunter (12 wins) tied for the team lead with 150 strikeouts. The staff ERA was 3.71, seventh in the A.L...Oakland finished in the first division (now the AL West) for the first time since the 1952 Philadelphia Athletics.
