Major League Baseball celebrated the 100th anniversary of the first professional team, the Cincinnati Red Stockings, managed by Harry Wright...The last full season the Reds played at their grand old ball park, Crosley Field... Team leaders: Lee May (38 homers, 110 RBI); Tony Perez (37 home runs, 122 RBI); Johnny Bench (26 homers, 90 RBI). Pete Rose led the majors in batting average and was second with 120 runs scored as well as 218 base hits. Rose, likewise, hit for a "triple double" with 33 doubles, 11 triples, and 16 home runs. He also drove in eighty-two. The Reds were the league leaders in batting average (.277), home runs (171) and runs scored (798)...Jim Merritt led the pitching staff with a 17-9 record, 144 strikeouts and eight complete games. Jim Maloney followed with twelve victories and led the staff with three shutouts. Reliever Clay Carroll won 12 games as well. Starter Tony Cloninger was an eleven-game winner. The staff ERA was 4.11...Cincinnati would end the year only four games behind the NL West champion Braves and just one game in back of the second place Giants. Atlanta won their season series, 12-6, while the Reds beat the Giants, ten games to eight.
