As bad as 1968 had been, 1969 was another season full of turmoil for the Phillies: Dick "Don't Call Me Richie" Allen was suspended for a month after failing to show up for a twin-bill against the Mets in New York. Manager Bob Skinner resigned August 6th fed up with upper management dealing directly with Allen and his problems rather than through his office. Skinner blamed Allen for the bad baseball the Phillies had played up until the time he quit. The team wasn't winning many games so the fans once again constantly booed Allen (mostly) and the team for the lousy baseball they had to endure. It came to the point where Allen would write "Boo" in the dirt around first base with his feet...On top of all that, the Phillies had hoped to move into a new stadium in 1970, but construction delays pushed those plans back to the '71 season. The Phillies would trade Allen to St. Louis in the off-season...

The expansion Montreal Expos' Bill Stoneman no-hit the Phils at Connie Mack Stadium, April 17th, in only his FIFTH major league start...Dick Allen DID lead the ball club with 32 home runs and 89 runs batted in. Promising youngster and Phillie minor league product Larry Hise clubbed 20 dingers and drove in 56 runs. Outfielder/third baseman Deron Johnson provided some needed pop as well with 17 homers and 80 RBI. Long-time fan favorite Johnny Callison added 16 home runs and 64 RBI. As a team, the Phillies hit .241 and 137 homers...Righthander Rick Wise led the pitching staff with 15 wins, 14 complete games and four shutouts. Lefty Grant Jackson topped the staff with 180 K's while winning fourteen contests, completing 13 games and tying Wise with four shutouts. Former Pirate "Woodie" Fryman was 12-15 for the year and struck out 150 batters. The staff ERA was tenth in the N.L. at 4.14...Just over 6,400 fans per game showed up to root(?) for the hapless Phils.
