Team leaders: Dick Allen (34 homers, 101 RBI); Joe Torre (21 home runs, 100 RBI). Bob Gibson, the National League's Cy Young Award Winner, led the Cards and tied for the N.L. lead with 23 victories. "Gibby" led the pitching corps with 274 strikeouts. Steve Carlton was only 10-19 for the season with 193 K's, but he struck out 16 Phillies in a game at Connie Mack Stadium, May 21st. After the Phils scored three runs off "Lefty" in the sixth inning, Carlton was lifted for a pinch-hitter in the top of the ninth when the Cards tied the score, 3-3. The Phillies won the game in the bottom of the ninth with Carlton not figuring in the decision. He walked two batters in the game... Gibson finished fourth in the N.L.'s Most Valuable Player voting...Joe Torre finished second in the N.L. batting race...Vic Davalillo set a National League and tied the major league record with 24 pinch hits in a season...Artificial turf replaced natural grass for the first time at Busch Stadium and would remain there for the next 25 years...The Redbirds hit .263 and 113 home runs...The staff ERA was 4.06 and gave up the fewest homers in the league (102).
