Dave Winfield, a multi-sport star (basketball and baseball) from the University of Minnesota, was taken in the first round (fourth overall pick) of the amateur draft, June 5th. He made his debut, June 19th, going one for four at the plate against the Astros without playing a game in the minor leagues. "Winny," as he was fondly called, had also been drafted by the NFL's Vikings, the Atlanta Hawks of the NBA, and Utah Stars of the now defunct American Basketball Association. (Winfield did not play football in college.) He would be inducted into the Baseball Hall of Fame in 2001...

First baseman Nate Colbert led the ball club with 22 home runs, 80 runs batted in, 73 runs scored, and 25 doubles. He tied catcher Fred Kendall for the most base hits (143). Dave Roberts followed with 21 dingers and 64 RBI. "Cito" Gaston popped 16 homers and drove in fifty-seven...Steve Arlin topped the pitching staff with eleven victories. Clay Kirby won eight games and led the staff with 129 strikeouts. Bill Greif was 10-17 with 120 K's. The hurlers compiled a 4.16 ERA, gave up the most home runs in the league (157), and allowed 770 runs to score...Padres' batters hit .244 (last in the N.L.) and 112 homers. They scored the circuit's fewest runs (548)...San Diego lost the season series to division champion, Cincinnati, 13-5, while finishing 39 games behind the Reds. The Padres did not win a single season series but in a big surprise, they split with the Dodgers, 9-9...Season attendance was just under 612,000--last in the league--at San Diego Stadium.
