The Rangers selected pitcher David Clyde with the first pick in the '73 amateur draft and signed him to a contract which included a \$125,000 signing bonus--the highest pay out ever to a fledgling major leaguer at that point. Just twenty-two days after pitching his last high school game, he was on the mound at a sold out Arlington Stadium for his first big league start. Clyde walked the first two batters, but settled in to pitch five innings and allowed one hit--a homer to the Twins Mike Adams. Considered to be "the next Sandy Koufax," Clyde won the game, 4-3, and struck out eight batters. Shoulder and arm injuries derailed his plans to be "the best pitcher ever." He won only 18 games in a brief career which ended in 1979...The Rangers ended the season 37 games behind the AL West champion, Oakland A's, who took the season series, 11-7. Texas won ONE season series, 7-5, over Detroit...As a team, the Rangers hit 110 home runs, stole 91 bases, and hit .255. They posted a league worst 4.64 ERA and the most runs allowed (844)...MGR's records: Herzog (47-91), Wilber (1-0), and Martin (9-14)...Jeff Burroughs led Texas with 30 homers and 85 RBI. Bill Sudakis hit 15 dingers and drove home forty-three while Toby Harrah popped ten homers and knocked in fifty. Alex Johnson had a team high 179 base hits. Three players tied for the team lead in runs scored (71): Burroughs, Vic Harris, and Dave Nelson...Jim Bibby topped the pitching staff with nine wins, 155 strikeouts, and 11 complete games. "Sonny" Siebert won seven games and struck out seventy-six. Lefty Jim Merritt was 5-13 and completed eight contests. Pete Broberg, Mike Paul, and Jackie Brown all won five ball games as well. Clyde (4-8) had 74 K's and walked fifty-four.
