Henry Aaron, 37 years of age, had an MVP-type season (he finished third in the N.L.): 47 homers (second in the majors); 118 RBI (third in the N.L.); .669 slugging percentage (tops in the majors); 10.5 at bats per home run (#1 in the majors); and 21 intentional bases on balls (tied for first in the majors). He even scored 95 runs while playing mostly first base for the injured Orlando Cepeda. His batting average was seventh best in the major leagues. Cepeda managed to hit 14 dingers and drive in forty-four. Ralph Garr led the ball club in batting average, runs scored (101), and base hits (219). N.L. Rookie of the Year, catcher Earl Williams, blasted 33 homers and drove home 87 runs...Ace Phil Niekro led the pitching staff with 15 wins, 173 strikeouts, 18 complete games, and four shutouts. Ron Reed won 13 contests and struck out 129 batters...The defending NL West Champs finished only eight games behind the first place Giants. The Braves were 7-11 versus San Francisco...Atlanta hit .257 for the year and finished second in the league with 153 home runs...The staff ERA was 3.75, tenth in the National League.
