The Cubbies celebrated their 100th season as a franchise (and 56th at Wrigley Field) by finishing 14 games behind NL East Champion Pittsburgh. Chicago won only six of the eighteen meetings between the two ball clubs...Team leaders: "Sweet Swingin'" Billy Williams (28 home runs, 98 RBI); Ron Santo (21 homers, 88 RBI); Jim Hickman (19 home runs, 60 RBI); and Joe Pepitone (16 homers, 61 RBI). Fergie Jenkins topped the pitching staff with a 24-13 W/L record, 263 strikeouts, and the most complete games in the majors (30). Milt Pappas won seventeen games while Bill Hands was a 12-game winner. Both posted fourteen complete games; Pappas led the staff with five shutouts. As a team, the Cubs led the league with 75 complete games...The staff's ERA was 3.61...The Cubs batted .258 for the season and hit 128 home runs.
