The expansion Senators (1961) played their eleventh and last season in D. C. after the A.L.'s team owners approved the ball club's move to Arlington, TX, on September 20th. The final game was a forfeit to the Yankees after those in attendance--angry about the loss of their franchise coupled with the absence of security guards at RFK Stadium--stormed the field with the Solons leading, 7-5, and two out in the top of the ninth, September 30th. Team owner Bob Short HAD received a last minute offer from a potential buyer to keep the Senators in D. C., but was dissatisfied with the final asking price... "The Capital Punisher," Frank Howard, was the team leader with 26 homers and 83 RBI... Number One starter Dick Bosman topped the pitching staff with 12 wins and 113 strikeouts. Former Tiger ace Denny McLain tried to resurrect a rapidly fading career, but only managed ten wins while losing twenty-two games with a tapped out pitching arm. He struck out 103 batters... Washington won only THREE season series from the Angels (8-4), the Indians (11-7), and the Yankees (11-7). The Senators hit .230 with 86 homers as a team and pitched to a 3.70 staff ERA... White shoes were worn for home games for only the '71 season.
