Under new MGR Chuck Tanner, the pathetic White Sox (106 losses in '70) found a spark with their energetic skipper...The Pale Hose finished 22 ½ games behind AL West champ, Oakland, but took eleven of eighteen games from the Athletics. The White Sox changed their primary uniform color to red with matching red caps and white pin-striped uniforms for home games...Team leaders: Bill Melton (33 homers, 86 RBI); Jay Johnstone (62 RBI) was next with 19 home runs. Carlos May was second on the team with 70 runs batted in... Ace knuckleballer Wilbur Wood led the pitching staff with a 22-13 record, 22 complete games, and seven shutouts. Tom Bradley won fifteen, Tommy John thirteen, and closer/spot-starter Bart Johnson won twelve to go with 14 saves. Fire-balling nineteen year old Terry Forster made his major league debut April 11th against the Twins and struck out one batter in an inning-and-a-third. He whiffed 48 batters during the season...The White Sox hit .250 as a team with 138 home runs. The staff's ERA was 3.12--fourth best in the league.
