Adrian Gonzalez was the Dodgers' team leader with 22 home runs, 100 RBI, 171 base hits, and 69 runs scored. Hanley Ramirez hit 20 homers and knocked in 57 runs despite playing in only 86 games. Yasiel Puig was a big "hit" after joining the team well into the season. He socked 19 homers and wowed everyone with his superior throwing arm. For the year, L. A. hit .264 and 138 home runs...Clayton Kershaw was 16-9 with 232 strikeouts, three complete games, and two shutouts. Zack Greinke posted a 15-4 record; Hyun-jin Ryu was 14-8. Kershaw also won the N.L. Cy Young Award. The staff ERA was second in the league (3.25)...Injuries to key players (Ramirez, Kemp, Beckett, Billingsley) primarily kept the ball club from getting off to a good start. On June 21<sup>st</sup>, they were 31-42 and in last place of the NL West 9 ½ games out of first. After that, the injured group started to return and the ball club reeled off a 46-10 streak through August 23<sup>rd</sup>. As the rest of the division stumbled and fell, the Dodgers kept winning and clinched the division September 19<sup>th</sup> ...L. A. beat the Braves, 3-1, in the NLDS, but lost to St. Louis in the NLCS, four games to two... "Skip" Schumaker's birth name is Jared.
