Mariano Rivera closed out a fabulous career placing him on the road to a sure-fire first ballot Hall of Fame selection...Derek Jeter and Mark Teixeira suffered through a miserable, injury shortened season for each: Jeter (recovery from a broken ankle), "Tex" (damaged wrist)... Team leaders: Robinson Cano (27 homers, 107 RBI); Lyle Overbay (14 home runs, 59 RBI); and Alfonso Soriano (17 dingers, 50 RBI). Soriano was reacquired from the Cubs mid-season...C C Sabathia led the pitching staff with a 14-13 W/L record and 175 K's. Hiroki Kuroda (150 strikeouts) and Andy Pettitte each won eleven contests. Pettitte retired after the season with 219 wins as a Yankee...Alex Rodriguez hit seven homers and knocked home nineteen runs in an injury-abbreviated season... The Yanks hit .242 and 144 home runs for the year...The staff ERA was 3.94 and yielded only 437 bases on balls--second fewest in the A.L....New York won six of nineteen meetings and finished twelve games behind the eventual World Champion (and arch-rival) Boston Red Sox.
