"Welcome to the American League East"...The Jays sought to make the playoffs for the first time since 1993 when they won the second of two consecutive World Championships. Closer B. J. Ryan was lost very early in the year to Tommy John surgery placing the bullpen in a state of flux. Injuries and ineffectiveness by two or three starters resulted in regular changes for the back end of the rotation. Besides Ryan, no more than eleven Blue Jays would wind up on the disabled list. At the All Star break, Toronto was in third place, ten games out of first with a 43-44 record. They would get no closer to first the rest of the season...Former White Sox slugger Frank Thomas, now the Jays designated hitter, led the ball club with 26 homers and 95 RBI. He hit career home run #500 June 28th against the Twins. "The Big Hurt" homered three times in a game September 17th versus Boston--only the second time he had accomplished that feat in his career at that point. Alex Rios was next with 24 home runs, 85 RBI, and was the team leader with 191 base hits and 114 runs scored. Bench super-star Matt Stairs socked 21 homers; Troy Glaus added twenty. Blue Jays batters hit .259 and 165 home runs for the year...Roy Halladay (16-7 W/L record, 139 strikeouts, seven complete games) kept the starting staff stable along with A. J. Burnett (10-8, 176 K's) and pleasant surprise Dustin McGowan (12-10, 144 strikeouts). McGowan took a no-hitter into the ninth inning against Colorado at Rogers Centre, June 24th. The Rockies' Jeff Baker singled with no one out in the ninth to spoil the no-no. McGowan finished with a complete game one-hitter. In Ryan's absence, Jeremy Accardo ably filled the role of closer. Shawn Marcum won twelve games. The staff ERA ended the year at 4.00, a flashy second in the league.
