Skipper Lou Piniella was signed to a three-year contract following the ‘06 season after the Cubbies had finished last in the NL Central. The team got off to a sluggish start which likely contributed to heightened tensions on the field. On June 1<sup>st</sup>, pitcher Carlos Zambrano and catcher Michael Barrett were part of a scuffle between the pair in the Cubs dugout. Apparently Zambrano felt Barrett was primarily to blame for five runs (four earned) scored in the fifth inning after Barrett had been charged with a passed ball and a throwing error. Piniella removed both players from the game which Atlanta led at the time, 7-1. The Cubs would lose 8-5. Two weeks later, Barrett and pitcher Rich Hill had heated words in the dugout during a 5-3 extra-inning loss to Seattle. In that game, Barrett had dropped a throw to the plate allowing a run to score. Within days, Barrett was traded to San Diego...With the ball club floundering with a 33-39 record, a 5-1 win by Zambrano over the White Sox, June 22<sup>nd</sup>, turned the season around. The Cubbies WON their division by two games after going 52-38 the rest of the season. Arizona quickly dispatched the Cubs in the NLDS with a three-game sweep...For the year, the team hit .271 and 151 homers. Alfonso Soriano was the leader with 33 home runs and 97 runs scored. Aramis Ramirez collected the most RBI (101) and hit 26 homers. Derrek Lee posted 180 base hits, the team high...Zambrano’s 18 wins topped the pitching staff. His 177 strikeouts were second to Hill’s 183. Hill won eleven games. New addition Ted Lilly was a 15-game winner while Jason Marquis won twelve. The staff ERA was 4.04 for the year.
