Managers' records: Narron (31-81), Mackanin (41-39)...Team leaders: Adam Dunn (40 homers, 106 RBI, 101 runs scored); Ken Griffey, Jr. (93 RBI); and Brandon Phillips (94 RBI). Each hit 30 home runs. Phillips topped the ball club with 187 base hits and 107 runs scored...Aaron Harang led the pitching staff with a sparkling 16-6 record and 218 K's. Next was Bronson Arroyo with nine victories and 156 strikeouts...As a team, the Reds hit .267 and 204 home runs. The staff ERA was 4.94 (tied with the Marlins for the worst in the N.L.). They gave up 853 runs (second most in the league) and surrendered 482 bases on balls (second fewest in the senior circuit).
