Team leaders: Roger Repoz (11 home runs); Dick Green (62 RBI); Bert Campaneris (153 base hits, 82 runs scored); Lew Krausse (14 wins), Jim Nash (12 wins, 5 complete games); "Catfish" Hunter (103 K's). Closer Jack Aker led the major leagues in saves...Two future stars made their debuts during the season: Rick Monday, 20, the first-ever player selected in the major league amateur draft (1965), joined the ranks September 3rd going zero for three at the plate against the Red Sox. Sal Bando, 22, also debuted the same day as Monday and went zero for three...The A's finished their second-to-last season in K. C. with a .236 team batting average and 70 homers. They led the A. L. with 56 triples. The pitching staff ended the year ranked sixth in the league with a 3.56 ERA...The A's were victors of the home opener and then lost fourteen of their next sixteen contests. The ball club avoided finishing in the cellar for the first time in three seasons after compiling a 50-49 record from June 19th to the end of the year. It turned out be the team's best extended performance its entire time in K. C.
