Larry Parrish hit three home runs in a game against the Yankees at Arlington Stadium, April 29th...Bobby Valentine was named manager, May 17th, which ushered in a positive turn-around for the ball club...Managers' records: Rader (9-23), Valentine (53-76)...Pete O'Brien was the team leader with 22 home runs and 92 RBI. Centerfielder Oddibe McDowell hit 18 homers and Parrish, now a right fielder for Texas, hit 17 homers and drove home 51 runs. Gary Ward socked fifteen dingers and led the ball club with 170 base hits and 77 runs scored. Part-timer Wayne Tolleson added 101 base knocks. The Rangers were tenth in the A.L. with a .253 batting average and twelfth with 129 home runs...Charlie Hough led the pitching staff with a 14-16 record, 141 strikeouts, and was second in the league with 14 complete games. Reliever Greg A. Harris punched out 111 batters. Hough's fellow starters Mike Mason, Burt Hooton, Frank Tanana, and Jeff Russell all had sub-par, disappointing seasons. Of the group, Mason had the most wins with eight. Former starter Dave Stewart, suffering from a sore arm, was relegated to the bullpen to sort things out. Stewart posted a record of zero and six, but managed to convert four saves. He was traded in September to the Phillies. Reliever Dave Schmidt started four contests and won seven games. The staff ERA was 4.56.
