Jimmy Rollins did it all for this ball club. He led the Phils with 23 homers, 68 RBI, 158 base hits, 102 runs scored, and 33 doubles. Catcher Carlos Ruiz knocked in 68 runs as well. He finished second to Rollins with 32 doubles and socked 16 round-trippers. Ryan Howard (14 homers, 56 RBI) and Chase Utley (11 home runs, 45 RBI), two vital cogs of the Phillies' offense, played in only 71 and 83 games, respectively. Hunter Pence contributed 17 dingers before his trade to the Giants at the trade deadline. Valuable leader Placido Polanco played in just 90 games. The Phils hit .255 and 158 home runs... Cole Hamels topped the pitching staff with a 17-6 record and 216 K's. Cliff Lee was only 6-9 but whiffed 207 batters. Kyle Kendrick and Roy Halladay both won eleven. Closer Jonathan Papelbon struck out 92 batters. The staff ERA was 3.83... After April, the Phillies could get no closer than 2 ½ games to the NL East leader (June 1<sup>st</sup>). At mid-season, they were 36-45, in fifth place and eleven games out.
