"The Grandy Man," Curtis Granderson, topped the Yankees with 43 homers and 106 RBI. Robbie Cano clubbed 33 homers, drove in 94 runs, and led the ball club with 105 runs scored. His 48 doubles were a team high. Granderson crossed the plate 102 times during the season. Captain Derek Jeter led the Yanks with 216 base hits and scored 99 runs. Both Mark Teixeira and Nick Swisher socked 24 dingers. Swisher had 93 RBI; Teixeira added eighty-four. Alex Rodriguez split time between third base and designated hitter. For the year, he hit .272 with 18 homers and 57 RBI. New York finished fourth in the A.L. in batting (.265) while leading the league with 245 home runs. They were second with 804 runs scored...The starting staff was led by Hiroki Kuroda and Phil Hughes who both posted 16 victories. C C Sabathia added 15 wins and another twelve came from the arm of the promising Ivan Nova. Sabathia led the staff in strikeouts (197). Hughes ended the year with 165 K's. Eighth inning set-up man David Robertson struck out 81 batters. The team ERA of 3.84 was fifth in the A.L. They allowed the fewest bases on balls (431). Mariano Rivera accidentally tore up his right knee shagging fly balls during pre-game batting practice in Kansas City, May 3rd, causing him to miss the remainder of the year. Rafael Soriano did a terrific job filling in as the Yanks' closer; he ended the year tied for third in the majors in saves...After eliminating the Orioles in five games in the ALDS, "The Bronx Bombers" were swept by the Tigers, four games to none, in the ALCS...The Yanks hit at least one homer in 131 regular season games to set a major league single season record...New York was 13-5 versus Boston and split the year's series with Baltimore, 9-9.
