The Marlins moved to their new digs at Marlins Park--built on the same site of the old Orange Bowl--and re-branded themselves. At the end of May, "The Fish" were 29-22, in second place, and just a half-game out of first. When the All Star break came around, the ball club was 41-44, in fourth place, and nine games from the top spot. Expectations had been very high for this team (ownership had uncharacteristically spent a lot of cash signing free agents), but it collapsed to a 28-49 record for the rest of the year. Manager Ozzie Guillen was fired after the season with only one year in the job...Giancarlo Stanton led the ball club with 37 homers and 86 RBI. Hanley Ramirez was next with 14 home runs. Jose Reyes appeared in 160 ball games and hit for a "triple double": 37 doubles, 12 triples, and 11 home runs. He was second on the team in RBI (57) and led the Marlins in hits (184) and runs scored (86). Outfielder Justin Ruggiano played in 91 contests and added 13 dingers. Miami hit .244 and 137 home runs...Mark Buehrle led the pitching staff with 13 wins while Josh Johnson (8 wins) posted the most strikeouts (165). Ricky Nolasco went 12-13 with three complete games including two shutouts. The staff ERA was eleventh in the N. L. at 4.09...Marlins Park is a venue full of bright colors which were reflected in the Marlins' new uniform ensemble, lots of black, orange, and sharp rainbow colors...The team finished LAST, 29 games behind the Nationals...Even with a new ball park, Marlins attendance for the year placed them twelfth in the league at just over 2.2 million...Between the '12-'13 seasons, ownership turned a "one-eighty" and unloaded several of their high-priced players after but one year on the roster.
