The "Injury Bug" hit the Red Sox HARD...nineteen players would spend time on the disabled list. Three starters, Jacoby Ellsbury, Dustin Pedroia, and Kevin Youkilis all suffered injuries which ended their seasons prematurely. Because of the out-of-commission personnel, several minor leaguers saw their first action in "The Show." Messrs. Marco Scutaro, Adrian Beltre, Mike Cameron, and John Lackey were vital acquisitions that helped keep the ship afloat...Offensively, the Bosox were led by DH David Ortiz who walloped 32 home runs and drove home 102 mates. Beltre had a super campaign: 49 doubles, 28 homers, and 102 RBI. Home runs from J. D. Drew (22) and Youkilis (19) were a big part of what made the Red Sox go. Scutaro led the Bosox in runs scored (92)...On the mound, Jon Lester led the pitching staff with a 19-9 record and 225 strikeouts. Clay Buchholz was 17-7 (120 K's) and newcomer Lackey was 14-11 (156 K's). The hurlers had a 4.20 ERA and a league leading 1,207 strikeouts...Red Sox batters were first in the league with 358 doubles, second with 211 home runs, and fifth in batting at .268...The season ended with Boston in a seven game deficit behind AL East champ, Tampa Bay. The Rays WON the season series, 11-7. The Red Sox opened AND closed 2010 with the Yankees; they split their season encounters against their arch-rivals, 9-9.
