Third baseman Jeff King led the Buccos with 18 home runs and 87 RBI. Catcher Mark Parent and outfielder Orlando Merced both hit 15 homers; Merced was second to King with 83 runs batted in. Three more Bucs hit thirteen dingers: Mark Johnson, Al Martin, and Jay Bell who also drove in 55 runs. Bell led the team with 139 hits. As a team, the Pirates hit .259 and 125 home runs for the year...Denny Neagle led the pitching staff with thirteen victories, 150 strikeouts, and five complete games. Esteban Loaiza was next with eight wins and Steve Parris had six. Paul Wagner (5-16) rang up 120 K's. The staff was LAST in the N.L. with a 4.70 ERA...The Bucs ended the season LAST in the NL Central, 27 games behind first place Cincinnati. Pittsburgh WON one season series: 8-6 over the Florida Marlins. They split twelve games with the Giants and eight contests versus Montreal. The Bucs were 5-8 against the Reds...Just over 900,000 fans saw Pirates' baseball at Three Rivers Stadium, the lowest attendance in the National League during the abbreviated season.
