Compared to the rest of the National League, the Dodgers were fifteenth in batting (.253), eleventh in home runs (149), and twelfth in ERA (4.38)...The ballclub was tied or held sole-possession of first place for most of April (largest lead was 4 ½ games in the NL West) and into mid-May, the last day May 14th at 21-15. They were 40-48, in third place, 7 ½ out at the All Star break...All Star and Silver Slugger recipient Jeff Kent led L. A. with 29 jacks, 105 RBI, 100 runs scored, 160 base hits, and 36 doubles. Three prime regulars, J. D. Drew, Cesar Izturis, and closer Eric Gagne, missed a good deal of the season. In 72 games, Drew popped 15 homers...Jeff Weaver led the pitching staff with 14 wins and 157 strikeouts...MGR Jim Tracy and GM Paul DePodesta were let go after the season. In Tracy's five years as skipper, he had a .527 winning percentage (427-383) and one first place finish (2004) losing to the Cardinals in the NLDS, three games to one.
