The Padres won the weak NL West with the lowest winning percentage (.506) in history. (The Mets won the NL East in 1973 with a .509 winning percentage but went on to win the league pennant.) Three teams in the NL East in 2005 had better records than San Diego--ALL missed the playoffs. San Diego won their division by five games over runner-up Arizona and were later swept from the post-season in the NLDS by the Cardinals, three games to none...For the year, the Padres hit .257, 130 homers, and led the N. L. with 29 triples. Ryan Klesko hit the most home runs (18). Brian Giles led the ballclub in RBI (83), base hits (164), runs scored (92), and doubles (38). He and Khalil Greene (70 RBI) both clubbed 15 jacks...All Star Jake Peavy's 13 wins, 216 K's, and 1.044 WHIP paced the pitching staff which wound-up the season with a 4.13 ERA, seventh among N. L. teams.
