The Rangers were a contending team for most of the season. They held first place alone/tied for 12 days in the first half, the last June 7th. The ballclub dropped to third for the remainder of the year, July 20th, seven games out of first. From that point to the end of the season, they were 31-38 (.449)...Texas wielded a lot of "artillery" at the plate. They hit the most homers in the big leagues (260) and produced the highest slugging percentage (.468). Mark Teixeira was the big bopper with his 43 jacks and 144 RBI. Alfonso Soriano clouted 36 home runs and drove home 104. A. L. batting champion Michael Young led the majors with 221 base hits. He hit 24 homers and knocked in 91. Six other regulars combined for 133 home runs. Texas bats also accounted for 311 doubles...The pitching staff didn't fare as well. Their 4.96 ERA placed them twelfth at the end of the season. Kenny Rogers won the most ballgames (14). Chris Young, who topped the staff in strikeouts (137), was a 12-game winner.
