The reigning World Champions matched the Yankees with the best record in the AL East, but New York claimed the top spot after beating the Red Sox in their regular-season series, ten games to nine. However, Boston captured the AL Wild Card before being swept in the ALDS by the White Sox, three games to none...Season Number One-O-Five for the home "nine" was loaded with a lot of fireworks on the part of Red Sox hitters. They led the league with a .281 batting average along with the most runs scored (910), base hits (1,579), doubles (339), RBI (863), on-base-percentage (.357), and OPS (.811). The shelling of A. L. pitching staffs to the tune of 199 home runs started with team-leader David Ortiz's 47, 148 RBI (the major league-high), and 40 doubles. He also topped the team with 119 runs scored. Right behind "Big Papi" was Manny Ramirez and his act of "Manny-being-Manny" as he belted 45 jacks and drove home 144 runs. Johnny Damon logged the most hits (197). Team captain Jason Varitek skipped free-agency by signing a huge four-year contract to remain in Boston. The team's heart-and-soul clobbered 22 homers...As for the pitching corps, the Red Sox finished eleventh in the league in ERA (4.74), but held four double-digit winners: Tim Wakefield (16), free-agent signee David Wells (15), Bronson Arroyo (14), and a pick-up from the Cubs, Matt Clement (13). This quartet, stepping up for the departed ace, Pedro Martinez, posted a combined 58-35 W/L record...Ortiz was second in league MVP voting, Ramirez was fourth...In the ALDS, the Red Sox were out-hit by Chicago .289 to .240 and out-scored 24 to 9. Boston gave up nine home runs and ended the series with a 7.56 ERA.
