The Royals finished 43 games behind the AL Central champion White Sox after compiling the most losses for a season in franchise history. The team recorded their third season with 100-plus losses in four years. They lost 19 straight games from July 28th through August 19th...Royals' batters hit .263 for the year (10th in the A. L.) and 126 home runs (14th). They scored 701 runs (12th)...Mike Sweeney was the team leader in homers (21) while Emil Brown collected the most RBI (86) and runs scored (75). Angel Berroa's 164 base hits were a team-high...The pitching staff posted the league's worst ERA (5.49) and allowed 935 runs (13th). Runelvys Hernandez's 8 wins topped the staff; twenty-one-year-old Zack Greinke racked up the most K's (114) and losses (17). He won five.
