"Bambi's Bombers" were right on target, finishing second in the American League with 185 home runs AND 291 doubles. The biggest of the bombardiers was "Stormin' Gorman" Thomas, a reliable centerfielder who ended the year with career highs in home runs (45), RBI (123), runs scored (97), on-base percentage (.356), slugging average (.539), and OPS (.895). His homer output led the league and tied the Phillies' Mike Schmidt for second in the majors. Cecil Cooper (24 jacks, 106 RBI) tied with the White Sox's Chet Lemon for the most doubles in the A. L. (44). Paul Molitor's 16 triples placed him third in the majors; his 188 base hits led the ballclub. Ben Oglivie hit 29 bombs to go with 81 RBI; Sixto Lezcano put a Gold Glove in his trophy case and contributed 28 home runs and 101 RBI...The Brewers pitching corps led the majors with 61 complete games. They tied the Orioles for the A. L.'s most shutouts (12) and allowed the fewest walks in the big leagues (381). The five main starters collectively won 71 games, around 75 percent of the team's wins. Mike Caldwell was 16-6 in W/L, Larry Sorensen and Jim Slaton both won 15 games, Bill Travers was 14-8 and "Moose" Haas 11-11. The staff ERA was 4.03 and racked up the majors' fewest strikeouts (580)...Milwaukee ended the year eight games behind the AL East champ Orioles; The Birds got the better of the Brewers during their regular season series, 8-5.
