The Cubbies came as close as second place and a half-game out of first on July 27th. They lost to the Mets in New York the next day starting a stretch of 26 wins and 40 losses until the end of the season...Manager Herman Franks was fired with seven games left on the schedule and a record of 78-77. Coach Joey Amalfitano became the interim MGR...Dave “Kong” Kingman bashed 48 homers to lead the major leagues and finished sixth with 115 RBI. Kingman also topped the N. L. with a .613 slugging percentage (2nd in the majors) and was second in the league (4th in the big leagues) with a .956 OPS. Jerry Martin’s 19 jacks and 73 RBI followed Kingman on the team. The Cubs ended the year third in the league in hitting (.269) and fourth in home runs (135)...Rick Reuschel’s 18 wins topped the pitching staff. Lynn McGlothen was next with 13 victories and a staff-high 147 strikeouts. Bruce Sutter posted the most saves in the big leagues. The staff ERA was 3.88 (9th). They led the majors with 933 K’s.
