Originally a sixth round draft pick of the Phillies in 2015 from USC, 27-year-old Tyler Gilbert made his MLB debut August 3rd pitching an inning and striking out two as part of a win over the Giants. His first major league start would be a memorable one: a no-hitter (the third in D-backs history) at Chase Field, August 11th. He struck out five and walked three Padres for his first big league win as well...Eduardo Escobar was traded to Milwaukee, July 28th, but his 22 homers and 65 RBI would remain the most on the ballclub at the end of the season. As a team, the D-backs hit .236 and led the N. L. with 308 doubles, topped by Josh Rojas's 32...The pitching staff finished with the league's worst ERA (5.11). Merrill Kelly and Madison Bumgarner both won 7 games, the best of the group...On June 17th after a loss to the Giants, Arizona set a modern-day major league record with 23 straight road losses. The streak ended at 24. They set a franchise record of 17 consecutive losses (home or away) shortly thereafter.
