The Giants season appeared to be over by the end of July. (They had stumbled into the All Star break 11 games out in fourth place of the NL West.) The deficit increased to 13 ½ games and five games below .500 by the end of the month. However, a doubleheader split with the Astros at Houston, July 31st, launched two full months of .600-plus baseball, igniting a run which carried into the season's final days. September was especially bountiful with the Giants winning 20 of their 27 ballgames (.741) placing them in a flat tie with the Dodgers for second one game behind Atlanta on the 30th. The schedule-makers must have been clairvoyant as Dodger Blue invaded Candlestick Park for the last three games of the year, October 1, 2, and 3. The Giants were eliminated from the pennant race by the Dodgers in the first two games as L. A. blitzed San Francisco, 19-2...Giants batters hit a combined .253 for the season while the pitching staff posted a very respectable 3.64 ERA...Jack Clark's bat remained the stick with the most bang. He ended the year leading the offense with 27 homers and 103 RBI. Twenty-two year old "Chili" Davis finished fourth in Rookie of the Year voting, slamming 19 home runs and driving in 76, the second-best numbers on the Giants... The pitching corps featured five double-digit winners. Starters Bill Laskey and Atlee Hammaker won 13 and 12, respectively, followed by reliever Fred Breining (11 W's). Closer Greg Minton's ten was matched by Gary Lavelle's ten. Minton's save total put him in a third place tie with "Goose" Gossage and Gene Garber across the big leagues, only six saves behind leader Bruce Sutter.
