Upon arriving at the Mets Wrigley Field clubhouse August 4, 1982, Joel Youngblood probably had no idea what was coming--the unthinkable. He was traded by the Mets to Montreal after that day game in Chicago during which he had driven in the winning run. Later that same evening, he singled in a game for the Expos against the Phillies at Veterans Stadium, becoming the first player in major league history to be part of such a feat. His hits came against two future Hall of Fame pitchers: Fergie Jenkins (Cubs) and Steve Carlton (Phils)..The Metsies finished dead last in the NL East. Their only month with a winning record was May (17-11)..Their front man, the all-or-nothing Dave Kingman, led the league with 37 home runs and the big leagues by striking out 156 times. Kingman registered only nine doubles but led the team with 99 RBI..Mookie Wilson's 58 stolen bases was the fourth-best total in the N. L.. Primarily a pinch-hitter, "Rusty" Staub, now 38, in his second tour with the Mets, once again received the unceasing adoration from Gotham's Mets fans. He hit three homers and drove in 27...The pitching staff's biggest winner, the gritty Craig Swan, posted 11 victories. The staff yielded the most runs in the league (723) despite a nifty--by today's standards--3.88 ERA.
