The '82 Rangers endured a very dismal season. Two of their better players of the previous few campaigns--"Bump" Wills and Al Oliver--were traded away. Wills went to the Cubs and Oliver to Montreal for third baseman Larry Parrish and first sacker Dave Hostetler. Upon their arrival, Hostetler immediately became the starter at first base while Parrish moved to a new spot in right field...The last time the Rangers were over .500 for the year was April 22nd at 6-5. By the All Star break, they were 35-46, in fifth place and 11 ½ games out of first. Manager Don Zimmer was fired with a 38-58 record and another former Red Sox skipper, Darrell Johnson, was installed in "Zim's" place, July 30th. Johnson guided the team to a 26-40 mark the rest of the way. Texas was shutout SEVENTEEN times during the year and their longest losing streak was twelve games. In the A.L. they were second-to-last in batting average (.249), twelfth in home runs (115) and LAST in runs scored (590). The pitching staff finished twelfth with a 4.28 ERA...Seven-time Gold Glove recipient "Buddy" Bell led the ball club in hits (159). He socked 13 home runs and tied Hostetler for the team lead in RBI (67). Hostetler hit the most home runs (22) while George Wright scored 69 times for a team high. Parrish smacked 17 home runs and drove in sixty-two. Wright added eleven dingers...Knuckleballer Charlie Hough led the staff with 16 wins, 128 strikeouts, twelve complete games, and two shutouts. Reliever Danny Darwin followed with ten victories. Frank Tanana (87 K's) was 7-18 with seven complete games. "Doc" Medich posted a 7-11 record while lefty Jon Matlack went 7-7 for the season and struck out seventy-eight.
