For the first time since 2017, the Braves did not qualify for the playoffs, ending a seven year run which included a World Championship in 2021...Two primary players for the Braves, Ronald Acuna Jr. and pitcher Spencer Strider returned to the ball club after rehabbing from serious injuries. Acuna had been out almost a year after undergoing his second (left) knee surgery. He came back in late May, got off to a scintillating start (.336 BA, 11 homers) then dealt with the injury bug once again--a lower back problem and a balky Achilles Heel, all in July. His season ended with a so-so (for him) 21 homers and 42 RBI, but getting back to playing status (95 games) was the greatest positive of any. Strider, sidelined since April 2024 after his second right elbow surgery, joined the rotation again at the start of the season, but would have to wait for his dominate self. He lost 14 games and struck out 131 batters...The Braves, who opened the year losing seven of their first seven games, righted the ship, poking over the .500 mark in mid-May before slumping the remainder of the campaign. Any hopes for the playoffs ended mid-September...Matt Olson's bat led the team in home runs (29), RBI (95), with a league-best 41 doubles. Michael Harris II got off to a horrendous start, but later turned around his season, finishing with 20 jacks and 86 RBI. NL Rookie of the Year, prodigal catcher Blake Baldwin, took over the position by storm and merit, ending his year with 19 homers and 80 RBI...Among the starters, Bryce Elder was the staff leader in wins (8). All Star lefty Chris Sale returned to the mound in fine fashion, striking out 165 with only 32 walks. He did not pitch enough innings to be on the leader board in the big leagues. On May 29th, he tallied his 2,500th career strikeout, the 40th pitcher in MLB history to reach that mark. His final record was 7-5...After the season, manager Brian Snitker called it a career. In nine full seasons and part of a tenth, he posted an outstanding record of 811-668 (.548). He had been a devoted member throughout the Braves organization for 49 years in many management-type capacities.
