Two years removed from a World Series appearance and only four years after a 110-loss season, the Snakes weren't sneaking up on anyone out of the grass or the Sonoma cacti in 2025. Torey Lovullo finished the year as skipper for the ninth straight year, a campaign certainly derailed by injuries to free agent addition and prime starting pitcher Corbin Burnes, as well as relievers A. J. Puk and Justin Martinez. All three were lost for the season after undergoing Tommy John surgery. With the team considered to be out of the pennant race at the trade deadline, the Diamondbacks chose to deal long-time starter Merrill Kelly to Texas. (In seven years wearing an Arizona uniform, Kelly was 62-50 with a 3.74 ERA.) The D-backs did play well enough to hold second place of the NL West at the All Star break, a game over .500, seven games out...Prior to a trading deadline move back to Seattle, Eugenio Suarez blasted 36 homers. A candidate for league MVP, Corbin Carroll was a monster at the plate with 32 doubles, 17 triples (most in the majors), 31 jacks and 84 RBI. Twenty-five year old Geraldo Perdomo posted a huge break-out season with 33 doubles, 20 home runs, 173 hits and 100 RBI. He, too, received a bushel of MVP votes. Ketel Marte cracked 28 homers...Zac Gallen and Brandon Pfaadt both won 13 games to lead the pitching staff. Gallen was high-man with 175 strikeouts.
